



PHIL BRYANT

Governor, State of Mississippi



Known for strong integrity and commitment to an accountable government, Phil Bryant was sworn in Mississippi's 64th governor on January 10, 2012. He was elected in November 2011 after capturing 62 percent of the vote. In his inaugural State of the State Address, Bryant outlined 31 bold initiatives that encompass his vision for Mississippians to "rise together" through economic expansion, efficiency in government and adherence to values that make Mississippi great. The close of the 2012 legislative session saw many of Bryant's new initiatives become law, including key components of his Mississippi Works agenda.

Strong, pro-job measures like the Health Care Industry Zone Act, the Small Business Regulatory Flexibility Act and Dual Enrollment are creating a solid foundation for Mississippi's success and economic vitality. Bryant also this year completed his mission to virtually eliminate Mississippi's antiquated business inventory tax by signing into law tax credits to offset the inventory burden.

At Bryant's urging, the Legislature this session passed a fiscal year 2013 budget that sets aside two percent of the state's resources to address unforeseen budget challenges. Also in the coming year, the state Department of Revenue, in response to Bryant's call for efficiency in government, will serve as a model for performance-based budgeting in the coming fiscal year.

Prior to becoming governor, Bryant served one term as Mississippi's 37th lieutenant governor after earning 59 percent of the vote in November 2007. He also served Mississippi as state auditor and represented his legislative district in the Mississippi House of Representatives for five years.

Bryant, the son of a diesel mechanic and a mother who stayed home with her three boys, learned early the values of hard work and the importance of education. The Moorhead native and former deputy sheriff earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Southern Mississippi and a master's degree in political science from Mississippi College. Before assuming his role as governor, Bryant served as an adjunct professor of government at Mississippi College.

Bryant is the contributing author of three books: 21st Century Government – Digital Promise, Digital Reality and Leadership Secrets of Government Financial Officials, the fourth and fifth volumes of a leadership series with an emphasis on financial management, human resources, technology, and auditing; and, Best Case Practices. This publication highlights the innovative initiatives of fellow Republican Lt. Governors all across our country.

Bryant's persistence in promoting conservative public policy stems from his belief that people, not the government, know best how to take care of their own money. His consistent views and actions in public service helped him earn the 2004 Statesman of the Year award presented by American Family Radio.

Because of his love of the outdoors and his belief in the second amendment, he has been a longtime member of the National Rifle Association's Institute for Legislative Action and is a recipient of the Kirk Fordice Freedom Award presented annually by the Central Mississippi chapter of the NRA. He served as the 2008 Honorary Chairman of the Republican Lieutenant Governor's Association and is a past president of the Mississippi Republican Elected Officials Association. He also served on the National Lieutenant Governor's Association Executive Committee as the Southern Region Republican at-large member.

Bryant's dedication to his work is evident through his years of public service, but his faith and family have always come first. Phil Bryant and his wife First Lady Deborah Bryant have two adult children and are active members of St. Marks United Methodist Church.





Associate Professor, MC School of Business

Mark McComb is Associate Professor of Management Science and a Director of the Center for Economic Education and Analysis in the Mississippi College School of Business. The Center for Economic Education and Analysis is a resource for state agencies and public and private sector organizations seeking economic research and data relating to the Jackson, MS area. The Center serves business and policy decision-makers by providing a significant source of key economic data for the area. He received his Ph.D. in Management Science from

the Stuart Graduate School of Business at the Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago. He has graduate degrees in Mathematics and Philosophy from the University of Louisville and is a 1980 graduate of MC with a B.S. in Mathematics. Mark worked as a quality manager and statistician for several companies before joining the faculty at MC. He continues his work with the professional community by teaching online Lean Six Sigma Master Black Belt certification courses for Villanova and by serving as an instructor for the American Society for Quality where he teaches seminars on Quality Engineering, Reliability Engineering, Black Belt Statistics, and Design of Experiments.

MIKE CHANEY





Prior to his election in 2007 as Mississippi's Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner Chaney served seven years in the Mississippi House of Representatives and eight years in the Mississippi Senate.

As Commissioner, he has brought a style of openness and accessibility to the office, including opening a Mississippi Insurance Department office on the Gulf Coast. Also, in his continuing effort to expand the insurance market on the Gulf Coast and in the state as a whole, he has overseen the addition of

125 new companies to write insurance in the state. He was recently selected by his peers at the National Association of Insurance Commissioners to chair the prestigious Property and Casualty "C" Committee. The NAIC is the organization of state insurance regulators for all 50 of the United States, Washington D.C., and five US territories. He is a businessman with a strong background in energy and agriculture and a strong advocate for consumers.

He is a 1966 graduate of Mississippi State University with B.S. in Business and Finance and is a veteran of the United States Army, serving in Vietnam in 1968-69.

AARON SISK



Senior Staff Attorney, Mississippi Department of Insurance Aaron Sisk has served as a Senior Staff Attorney for the Mississippi Department of Insurance since November of 2006. Originally from Madison, MS, Aaron received his Juris Doctor in May of 2003 from the University of Mississippi School of Law and became an active member of the Mississippi Bar in October of that same year. Prior to that, Aaron completed his undergraduate education at Mississippi State University, earning a B.A. in Sociology with a certificate in Criminal Justice.

Aaron serves as the Director of the Insurance Department's Life and Health Actuarial Division. In this role, Aaron works closely with Department actuaries and industry representatives to assure

compliance with Mississippi and Federal statutes and regulations. The Life & Health Division is also tasked with managing the development of One, Mississippi: Mississippi's Health Insurance Marketplace and monitoring all market reforms associated with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010.




JIM CASADABAN
